How To Get My Learner's Permit:

Step One: Study before going to the DMV, prevent the 50% fail rate

- The DMV has 50 Class C genuine permit test questions with answers on their website <https://www.dmv.ca.gov/portal/dmv/detail/pubs/interactive/tdrive/exam>
- Do these sample questions repeatedly until achieving a perfect score to help a first time pass

Step Two: Pre-apply on the DMV website (NOW REQUIRED BY DMV)

- eDLapp.DMV.ca.gov
 - Print the **"confirmation receipt"** after uploading your documents, preferably in color
 - No appointment needed
 - Check the DMV website to make sure the DMV you are going to is now open
 - Go to DMV when the line is not so long, so as not to get turned away,
 - Mid-week mid-morning like all state offices tends to have the shortest lines
 - Make your "confirmation receipt" visible as you stand in line while they are filtering everyone
 - The more over crowded the line is, the more the line looks like people are NOT observing social distancing, the more people DMV staff will filter out of the line at that moment

- A Second way to upload your documents to DMV is to follow this this link <https://www.edl.dmv.ca.gov/apply/id-and-license/sign-in> to create an account with ID.me
 - Once you upload your documents you will get a confirmation number. (Please Print out in color)
 - Once you arrive at DMV as a walk in you can show the confirmation number Print out to get in.

Step Three: Bring the Completion Certificate from the Driver's Ed Course

- The DL400C Driver's Education pink completion certificate (included in this envelope)

Step Four: Applicant must be at least 15½ years old exactly or older

Step Five: Bring Documents Acceptable to DMV

- DMV does not accept copies, only original or certified copies
- Generally a US birth certificate, social security card, and 2 proofs of residency are required
- Go to [DMV.ca.gov](https://www.dmv.ca.gov) and you will see various links on exactly what documents are acceptable
- Bringing a part but not all of the documents will result in denial of application
- Bring the application fee; pay by cash, check or debit card; DMV won't take credit cards
- Add your teenager to the family auto insurance policy
- After passing the test go to BakkersDrivingSchool.com to self-schedule the first driving lesson online
